


Biographical note



Bob Brown celebrated 50 years of work, study and struggle in the student and youth, human and civil rights, national liberation and Black Power, Pan-African, socialist, anti-war and anti-draft, anti-zionist and anti-repression movements in August 2013.

He was a member of the Chicago Chapter of the Congress of Racial Equality (1963-1968); director of the Midwest Office of the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (1967-1968); and co-founder of the Illinois Chapter of the Black Panther Party (1968-1969). He has worked with and supported hundreds of progressive and revolutionary movements, organizations and governments in every corner of Africa, the African Diaspora and the World. He

is currently a member of the Pan-Africanist Congress of Azania; an organizer for the All-African People's Revolutionary Party (GC) (1972-2013); and co-director of the Kwame Ture Institute.

He authored Slavery and the Slave Trade Were and Are Crimes Against Humanity; edited the new edition of Stokely Speaks: From Black Power to Pan-Africanism; and contributed an interview to We Have Not Been Moved: Resisting Racism and Militarism in 21st Century America. He is a researcher for a full-featured documentary film titled Kwame Ture (Stokely Carmichael) Dances in the Fire!

He is in the process of completing research for a book titled "To prevent the coalition of militant black nationalist groups ... [and] the rise of a messiah." A Case Study of the War against Kwame Ture (Stokely Carmichael).
